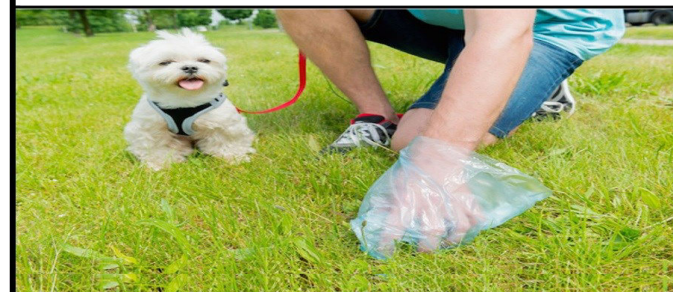

DISCUSSED SEPT 6th MEETING:

- Reinstatement of OHPNA board members/appointment of officers, including a new Treasurer, Don DeGroff. There are currently 2 vacant positions on the board.
- Adoption of the "5 minute rule." Background: Board members and neighbors at previous meetings have engaged in debates that would have the meeting go 1.5—2 hours. With the new rule, you can speak for 5 minutes before leading to a vote/discussion. Hopefully will keep meetings to an hour or less.
- A neighbor had questions about the covenants, i.e. parking an RV in the front yard. There is a misconception that the Board is trying to do away with the covenants. This was never the case. We just want to make sure they align with city code.
- A vote was held on reducing annual dues for next year. It did not pass with a vote of 2 for/9 against.
- A vote was held on renaming the OHPNA Scholarship. It also did not pass with 1 for/10 against.
- Planning continued for the annual neighborhood garage sale and National Night Out.

OUR NEXT MEETING will not be until **MONDAY, November 7th, 7 P.M.** at our neighborhood Pizza Hut (right outside the Jones-Maltsberger entrance). There will be no October meeting due to conflict with National Night Out and Columbus Day.

The OHPNA has scheduled a Nov. 4-6 Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) course for Oak Hollow Park at the Bexar County Fire Marshal's Office on Southton Road. As many have read in recent editions of Pebbles, CERT is a skills- and team-building course that teaches neighbors, co-workers, students, congregants, and others to collectively prepare for, and effectively respond to, a range of natural or man-made disasters. This was to be a small, "high-speed" session for OHPNA board members to get "CERTified" as immediate responders and become readiness advocates to conduct an ongoing OHP-wide conversation about readiness. However, with few of these courses scheduled in the coming months, Bexar County and the Texas Dept. of Emergency Management have asked me to open up enrollment to area neighborhood associations and statewide to interested individuals. Therefore, this valuable readiness opportunity is now open first-come, first-served, to Oak Hollow Park residents. If you are interested in upping your household preparedness "game" AND becoming a member of the OHP Readiness Group, view the videos linked below and email me at: ohpna.questions@gmail.com. Class enrollment is limited to 30 students and you will need to commit to a training period that begins on a Friday evening, lasts all day Saturday and at least a half-day Sun (the course lists 20-24 instructional hours, but we are averaging 12-16 hours based upon student performance and skills mastery). If you choose to enroll, please include the following in your email: name as you want it to appear on course certificates; address; best phone number for short-notice contact; preferred email address. We will have a readiness information table at the Oct. 4 Neighbors Together event in the Pebble Height cul-de-sac, but keep in mind: CERT courses quickly reach student capacity, especially when fewer courses are offered. Stay safe, and I look forward to helping you keep OHP a safer, better prepared community.

OHP NEIGHBORS ATTEND COP COURSE

Four Oak Hollow Park residents, including three OHPNA board members, attended the Sept. 10 Citizens On Patrol class at SAPD's North Substation on Jones-Maltsberger Road.

Pres. Kevin Jernigan, At-Large Members Les Besetsny and Bob Jostad, along with wife Cari Jostad, were part of a class that numbered 15 students, one of the largest recent Northside Substation COP sessions.



COP teaches residents how to safely observe and report to law enforcement agencies suspicious or criminal activity in their neighborhoods using cell phones and online tools. Subjects covered in COP also are useful for establishing a Neighborhood Watch program. After passing a criminal background check, COP graduates are eligible to participate in ride-alongs with officers and attend periodic refresher courses.

In addition to COP, SAPD offers other volunteer training opportunities, including the 12-week Citizens Police Academy, and Family Assistance Crisis Teams and Volunteers in Policing programs.

The next North Substation COP course will be Monday Oct. 3 from 6—9pm. Online registration is no longer necessary; COP accepts walk-in students, but using the following link to download and complete an application in advance will save time at the beginning of the course (note that the pdf application is still titled "Cellular On Patrol," the programs' previous title):

www.sanantonio.gov/SAPD/Downloadable-Forms. Bring your completed application and Texas Driver's License as proof of identity.
