It appears we may actually have an early Spring this year. No freeze warning forecast before 15 March, so looking good. With already 7.5 inches of rain this year, which puts us over 3 inches ahead of the norm, it should also be a very green Spring with Bluebonnets galore.

There will be elections this year for a new Council person in District 10, a Mayoral selection and voting on the \$850 Mil bond package. There will be a District 10 Candidates Forum hosted by the Northeast Neighborhood Alliance on 20 March at 6:30 pm. It will be held at the Toolyard, across Wurzbach Parkway from Heroes stadium. You can meet and talk with all 10 candidates at that time to help with your decision.

As tempting as it may be to trim your Live Oaks, the danger of Oak Wilt is very serious. Avoid pruning Oak Trees between 1 February and 30 June - when beetles are most active and fungal mats produce spores. And always disinfect pruning tools before use, paint the wounds immediately and hire only licensed professional pruners who have a tree maintenance license through the City of San Antonio.

Solid Waste will complete the "Pay-as-you-throw" program having distributed colored bins to everyone in April. If your bin needs repair or replacement, call 3-1-1 and submit the request.

City Public Service (CPS) has a program called a home energy ASSESSMENT. If you would like one done on your home, call CPS and make the request. One of the things they do as part of that visit is to replace all of your existing incandescent bulbs with new LED bulbs - for FREE.

Enjoy Spring Break. The new neighborhood directories will be distributed this month. Plan your summer now and beat the rush! Meet your neighbors, spruce up the place for Spring and get those taxes done.

## May 6 is Election Day

Voter Registration deadline is April 6, 2017 for the May election.

If you are new to the area you must change your address with the election office before you will be allowed to vote.

At this time an ID will be required to vote
