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Welcome to 2022. The annual Board election is now behind us and the new Board will be in place in February. The turnout this year was very encouraging, as the participation level was up significantly. In previous years it was often hard to find even 13 people willing to donate their time and effort to be Board members, even though they only meet once a month. This year there was a full slate of people, in addition to 10 added write in candidates. Thanks to all who have contributed in the past, and all who participated this year. Kevin Jernigan will be the new President of the Association, so you can expect to see his comments here in the February Pebbles.

It has been an interesting time on the Board. Upgrading the dilapidated wooden fence around Oak Hollow Park to the nice masonry fence we have today started way back in 1995 as a project of the Association. It took 80% participation of the residents to make it happen and was a 3-year long endeavor. I volunteered as one of the 3 supervisors of the installation nightly for over a year and a half, and I was not on the Board. Our neighborhood could not afford to build such a fence today. I was elected to the Board "at large" in 1998, Vice-President in 2002 and then President in 2005. So the 16 year run as President was never expected to last anywhere near that long. We created and sold a neighborhood cookbook with favorite recipes from residents and dignitaries. The sale generated revenue to create the entrance flower beds and plant those trees along 1000 Oaks. We managed to get a left-turn lane into the neighborhood off of 1000 Oaks out of safety concerns for our residents. With the support of our neighbors, a lot was accomplished to benefit the neighborhood. A lot of major items, and numerous minor items, were accomplished, and I was happy to volunteer however needed along the way.

My thanks and appreciation to all who pitched in and helped with each endeavor. I hope that by tax time this year Covid, even the Omicron variety, will give up and be gone and we can get back to normal. Hopefully this year will be MUCH better (with no deep freeze and power outages...) than last. Happy New Year. Cheers!

City of San Antonio proposed Bond Program

2022 Bond Program overview

The City's long-term Debt Management Plan includes a General Obligation Bond Program every five years to fund major capital infrastructure projects throughout the City. In May 2022, San Antonio residents will consider a \$1.2 billion municipal bond program. This bond program is larger than the \$850 million voter-approved bond program in 2017. If approved by voters in May 2022, the city-issued debt will support key infrastructure projects in five categories: Streets, Bridges and Sidewalks, Drainage and Flood Control, Parks Recreation and Open Space, Facilities and Housing.

There is no recommended increase in the City's Ad Valorem Tax Rate to support the 2022 - 2027 Bond Program

During January and February the Mayor and City Council will adopt a Project List.

May 7, 2022 will be the public vote on the Bond
