Greetings from the President, Ron Van Kirk

We have experienced our Covid Pandemic, our drought, our freeze, and strangely enough, almost 6 weeks of rain. The aquifer is back up and watering restrictions are gone. So now we can PARTY!

Fiesta 2021 is scheduled to begin on June 17 with about 50 events, which is scaled down from the 115 events you would normally see. The Annual 10-day "party with a purpose" usually happens in April. It was first pushed to November in 2020 due to the coronavirus pandemic and eventually canceled. Back in February, the Fiesta Commission announced that Fiesta 2021 would move from April to June 17-27-2021. Each Fiesta event will have its own COVID-19 safety protocols, but the Fiesta Commission has encouraged all of its participating member organizations to follow CDC, Metro Health, City of San Antonio and Bexar County guidelines. Many Fiesta events will require face mask wearing and social distancing. NIOSA starts on 22 June.

While mortgage rates have remained low, the housing market has increased. People are getting weekly calls to see if they are interested in selling their home. Competition for homes in our neighborhood has increased so much so, that one of our homes just sold for \$370,000! Be ready for that tax protest next year!

Kudos to Robert Ramirez for spearheading contact with SAWS, CPS Energy and others, and communicating through the City's 3-1-1 line to coordinate visual improvements to our neighborhood. Faded Street signs have been replaced, retention walls have been repainted to wipe out graffiti, and repainting of our fire hydrants is in the process of being addressed. Fresh paint and sprucing up certainly make the area look more appealing.

Amazing how the 6 weeks or rain have turned the grass and shrubs that survived the freeze into beautiful GREEN. Let's enjoy it while we can, as the summer heat is rising and future rain is always unpredictable. Be patient while traveling if you head out. As things continue to open up the crowds have materialized quickly.

City of San Antonio FY 2022 budget survey open for resident input

The City of San Antonio's seventh-annual SASpeakUp on the 2022 budget survey is open for residents to share their feedback with City officials. There continue to be financial constraints due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Feedback collected from the survey will help the Mayor and new Council understand and prioritize service needs for the entire community.

The budget survey gives residents the opportunity to weigh in on their service priorities. Residents can also share their thoughts on restoring programming from budget cuts made in FY 2020 and FY 2021.

"We encourage the entire community to complete the budget survey, it is one of the most important ways residents can help guide the City's budget making process," said City Manager Erik Walsh. "The pandemic has brought more needs and with budget restraints we need input to balance the budget so that we can continue providing critical services to our residents and prioritize areas of need."

The survey is available in English and Spanish and will close on June 21, 2021. City residents can take the survey on www.saspeakup.com or by texting SASpeakUp to 55000 to take the survey on their mobile devices.

The City will also host two telephone town hall meetings to gather input from residents. The meetings will be held **Tuesday, June 22 and Wednesday, June 23 at 6 p.m.** to give residents the opportunity to participate and ask questions live from the comfort of their home.
