Landscape watering with an irrigation system or sprinkler is permitted any day of the week before 11 a.m. or after 7 p.m.

Greetings from the President, Ron Van Kirk
 Usually by mid July we have hit triple digits and are dry. This has been a strange year in that the far northwest states are having the excessive heat, and wild fires, and here we are still seeing temps in the 80's. And all the more impressive is that while last year our total rainfall was just over 20 inches, already this year we have passed that mark due to the almost daily rains. It is still GREEN in mid-July! There is no water rationing, and in fact the aquifer actually went UP almost 7 feet the first half of this month.

There has been some recent curiosity over attendance at an OHPNA Board meeting. These meetings are open and can be attended by residents. However, due to the small size of our neighborhood, these meetings are held on a rotating basis at the private homes of the elected OHPNA Board members. As a result, there is limited space for each meeting. If there is a presentation to the Board, space is even more limited. We have a General Membership meeting each January in a larger facility - which over the past decade, or longer, has seen additional attendance of maybe only 4 or 5 residents, if any, in addition to the Board members. Any large interest issue garners a larger space also, with possibly a special meeting, like the "free mailbox replacement" issue 2 years ago. But if any resident would like to attend a Board meeting, to be sure attendance can be accommodated, please call me (210-491-0567) a few days in advance and let me know of your intentions, in case there is a private home capacity limit, so spacing can be properly managed for your convenience, and there are no last minute surprises.

Over the next few weeks you should see the replacement of faded signs at our entrances, new notification sign holders and the re-painting of the fire hydrants in the neighborhood, which is being coordinated by Niekos Robbins and Levi West, 2 students here in the neighborhood. The Welcome committee is being restarted for the neighborhood. So if you are aware of any new residents moving in, please let someone on the Board know, or advise Maureen Lancaster, the Pebbles editor, and she will pass on the word, and assist in making sure the new family is welcomed.

Keep the sunscreen handy. We will see warmer temperatures, and we still have half of the summer yet to go!
