While the far northern states experienced the lowest  
temperatures in a generation last month, with wind chills as  
low as **minus** 55 degrees, we were luckier and barely got hit  
with the upper 30's. And that is interspersed with temps that  
got as high as the upper 70's, nearly 80. Has anyone asked you  
lately why you live here?

Have you been downtown lately? If you have, you have  
certainly seen the massive amount of dockless scooters and  
bicycles that have flooded the area. While these are loved by  
some people, they are hated by others as an eyesore and even a  
hazard. The City Council will be voting on 14 February, at  
their council meeting, on new amendments to the Dockless  
vehicle pilot program to address these issues.

Just a reminder that parking oversize vehicles (over 24 feet  
in length, 8 feet wide or 8 feet high) in residential areas is  
officially a City code violation, and the fine is now \$500.

Lyle Larsen has filed House Bill 725, to move the primary  
election in Texas from March, to the fourth Tuesday in  
January. That would make The Texas primary the first in the  
country. Voting earlier would give Texans more of a voice in  
the presidential candidate nomination process.

District 10 has a dedicated Code Enforcement officer—  
David Garcia (210-478-1424). If you believe there is code  
violation you need to report, you can either call 3-1-1, or call  
David directly!

### No Soliciting?

Irritated by those vendors at your  
door, when there are no soliciting signs  
at the entrances? Well by code, if the  
streets are maintained by the city, as  
ours are, signs at the entrances will not  
do the job. Each house must have their  
own "NO Soliciting" sign posted for the  
restriction to be legally enforceable.

### SAFFE Officer

If you have an issue to report, that is not a 911 matter, say a house where suspicious daily activity is noted, and you would like to remain anonymous, please contact our SAFFE Officer Crystal Aguerro 210-207-5184. She will coordinate the information forwarding. The SAFFE officer need first hand info, so call her directly so she can have accurate data. Use 911 for emergencies, and never post the info on Facebook for the police - it will not be seen! Do not overlook any issue you feel should be addressed, as manpower is assigned based on need. So if you never call in anything that you thought deserved attention, you will also see a reduced police presence in the area.

### Making Texas Matter in Presidential Elections: House Bill 725

It's time for Texans to have a voice in choosing our presidential candidate! Current law requires Texas to hold primary elections in March, which means the presidential nominees are effectively chosen before Texans have an opportunity to vote. Having to wait until March means many Texans go to the polls and cannot vote for their preferred candidate because the candidate has dropped out of the race based on results of primaries and caucuses in states that hold their elections earlier.

House Bill 725 moves the date of primary elections in Texas to the fourth Tuesday in January, making the Texas primary elections the first in the country. There is no reason why Iowa and New Hampshire should determine the presidential nominees for the entire nation. Moving Texas's primary date to the beginning of the calendar ensures Texans get a voice in the presidential candidate nomination process. HB725 filed by Lyle Larson for 2019!
