During a special meeting of the City Council on 24 June, the Council approved an ordinance to grant a resident Homestead exemption in the City for 2019. The city Homestead Tax exemption, in combination with the recent passage of House Bill 3, which provides for school district tax cuts, will provide meaningful relief for homeowners in San Antonio.

Hopefully we can make it thru the rest of the summer without water rationing. Use sun screen while soaking up the tanning rays. Stay safe and see you in August.

Scooter update

As of 30 June riding electric scooters on sidewalks is prohibited. It is also prohibited in Lamo Plaza, the Riverwalk as well as City parks and trails. Riders must be 16 or older. Only one person per vehicle is allowed. Pedestrians always have the right of way. The maximum number of permits for these dockless vehicles that will be authorized to the seven operators will be 8,850, which is a major decrease from the current total of 16,100.
